



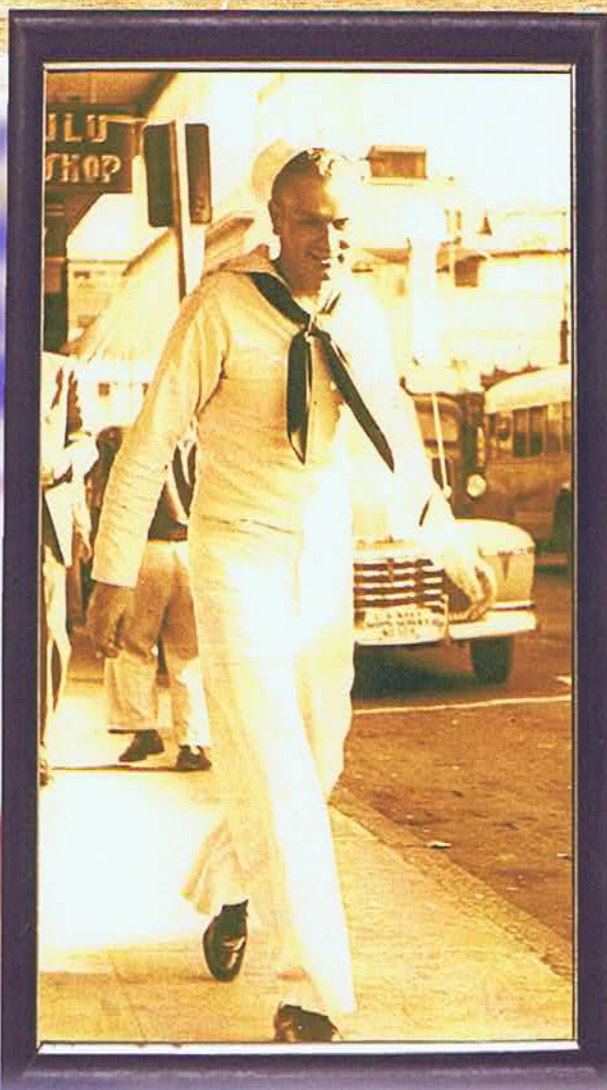

## HARRY ROEHM OF BELLE RIVE WAR CASUALTY

**Parents Receive Word He Was  
Lost When Battleship Ari-  
zona Was Sunk.**

Harry Turner Roehm, 23, son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry L. Roehm of Belle Rive, was lost when the U. S. battleship Arizona was sunk, his parents have been notified.

Roehm enlisted in the U. S. Navy shortly after his graduation

from the Opdyke Community high school in 1937. After training at San Diego, California, he was stationed for a time at Bremerton, Washington. He was then sent to Hawaii.

As a member of the crew of the battleship Arizona he was rated as a machinist's mate, second class. He also held a civilian pilot's license.

Besides his parents, he is survived by one sister, Mrs. Jennie Hunt of Mt. Vernon and one brother, Harley, of Belle Rive, a high school student.
