



Parents Receive Word He Was Lost When Battleship Arizona Was Sunk.

Harry Turner Roehm, 23, son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry L. Rochin of Belle Rive, was lost when the U.S. battleship Arizona was sunk, his parents have been notified.

Roehm enlisted in the U. S. Navy shortly after his graduation



from the Opdyke Community high school in 1937. After training at San Diego, California, he was stationed for a time at Bremerton, Washington. He was then sent to Hawnii.

As a member of the crew of the battleship Arizona he was rated ne a machinist's mate, second class. He also held a civilian pilot's license.
