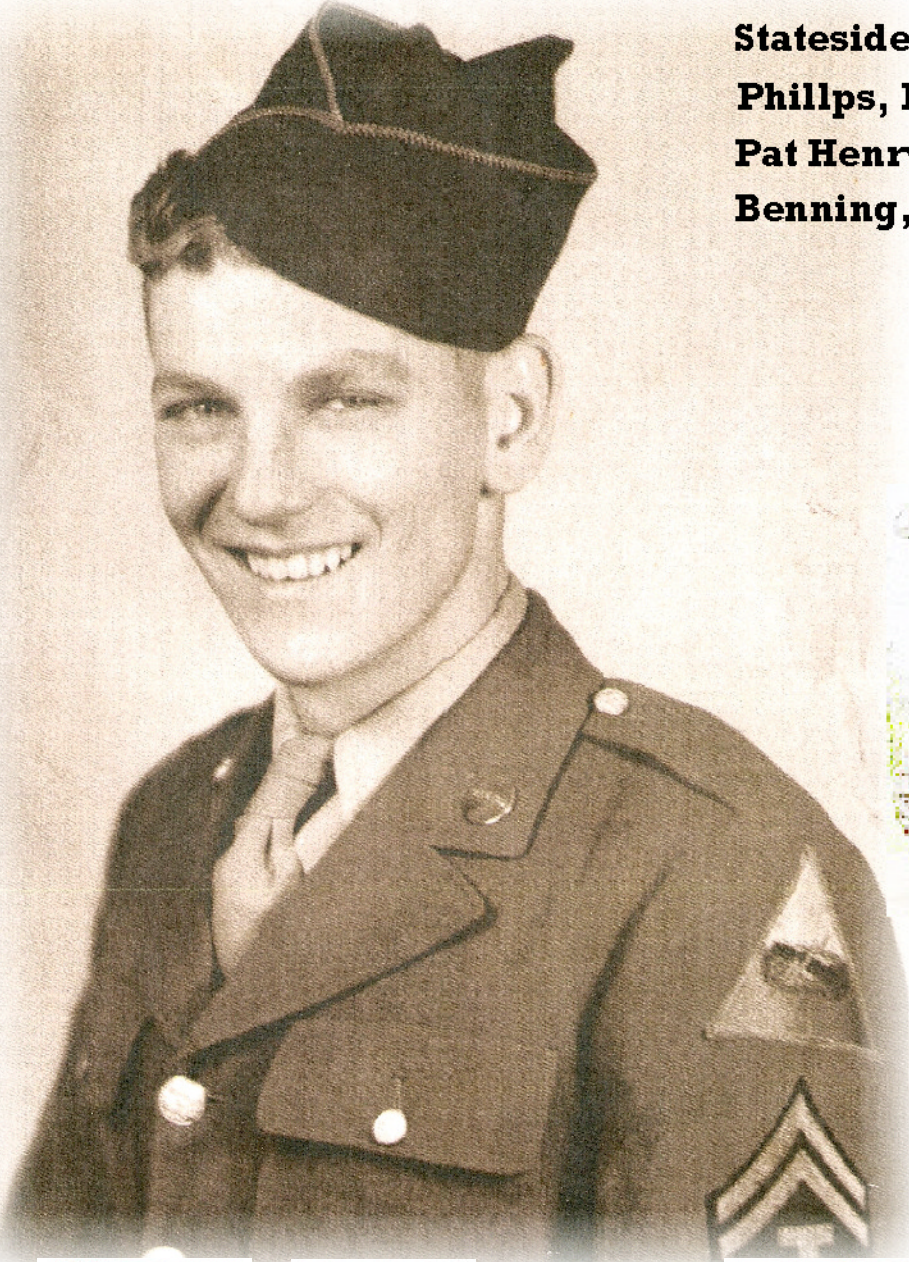

The 787th was in the ETO for five months, sped across central Germany at the war's end averaging 160 miles per day and was delayed only by by-passed pockets and taking prisoners. The first tanks to cross the Danube river were piloted by 787th men. Under the command of Lt. Col. Donald E. Mathes, Houston, TX, the 787th returned to the States with one battle star. It is under the 15th Armored Group at Fort Jackson.
