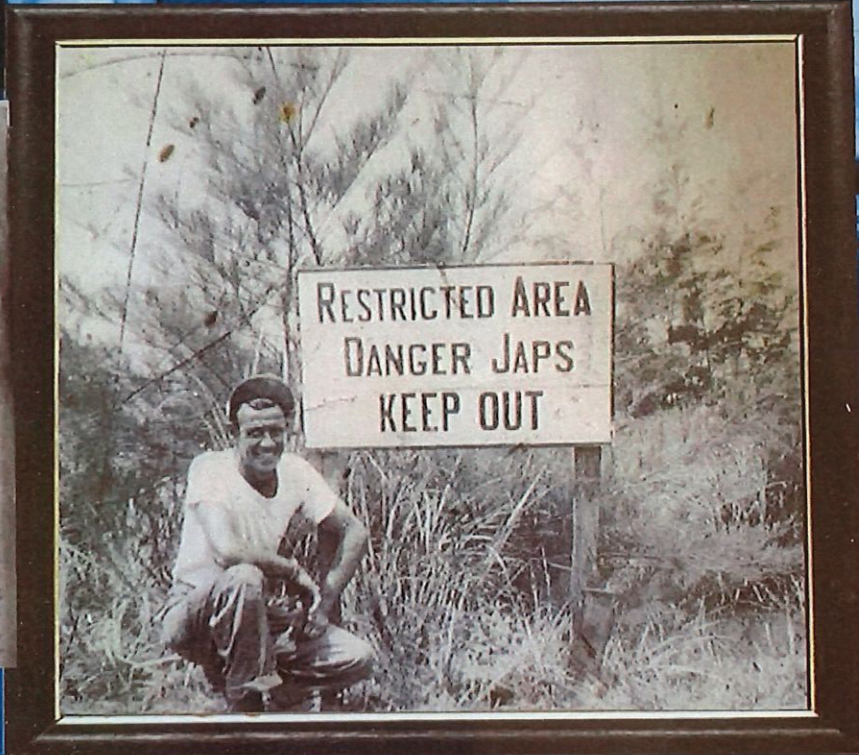

He wears four overseas bars, the Pacific-Pacific ribbon, one Brown Star, the Good Conduct ribbon and the World War II Victory ribbon.

**REMARKS OF MILITARY OCCUPATIONS**
